2	Tresser et al., 1994	2,5-year-old male	Rapidly enlarging soft mass with sinus opening
3	Roholt et al., 1995	4-days female new-born	Protruding mass tissue, non tender, soft fluid-filled, with translucent surface and telangiectasiae
4	Yu et al., 2001	4-year-old male	Soft mass detected at birth, with gradual growth and clear mucoid fluid drainage
5	Tanita et al., 2002	46-year-old male	Recurrent malignant melanoma appearing over a congenital mass
6	Manconi et al., 2003	8-year-old female	Congenital asymptomatic cyst
7	Ozel et al., 2005	1-year-old female	Hyperemic induration with purulent drainage
8	Schouten van der Velden et al., 2006	20-year-old male	Chronic fistula associated to a deep cyst
9	Adim et al., 2010	15-year-old male	Crusted and papillomatous plaque
10	Al-Balushi et al., 2011	3-year-old male	Cystic lesion gradually increasing in size
11	Nakamura et al., 2011	4-year-old male	Mass with recurrent infection and purulent secretion
12	Lacruz et al., 2012	2-year-old male	Asymptomatic nodule since birth, with continuous growth
13	Perrot et al., 2013	22-month-old female	Slightly hyperpigmented nodule with exudation
14	Sun et al., 2014	18-month-old male	Skin-colored mass with draining sinus
15	Mir et al., 2018	5-year-old female	Enlarging lump, which developed erythema, induration and purulent drainage
